Fiona Crofton's background is built upon a systems and design foundation. She has been working explicitly as a change and development consultant for more than 30 years and brings to this role her earlier, overlapping experiences of 7 years as a systems analyst/designer; 10 years in private practice as a personal and professional development specialist; and ongoing work as a sustainability practitioner, researcher, educator, and change agent. She believes education is a key factor in change; as a result, she seeks to ensure that all her work facilitates learning.

Fiona offers an innovative, integrated approach to contemporary challenges of needs assessment, multi-stakeholder involvement, planning, policy-making, design, and action implementation. Her particular emphasis is on increasing exploration and communication across different function, discipline and values areas in order to facilitate understanding, and to more adequately define and meet the needs and expectations of diverse interest groups.

For the past more than 25 years, Fiona has devoted her attention exclusively to issues related to sustainable development. She combines technical and social science knowledge with skills in analysis, synthesis, strategic planning, process-design and team-building. This combination of knowledge and skills enables her to facilitate communication, collaboration and collective action among individuals of diverse backgrounds and varying levels of expertise to the mutual benefit of all concerned. As a result of her work, Fiona has received recognition and awards as a sustainability leader, educator, and catalyst for change.
